

STUDY GUIDE QUESTIONS – WEEK 30

- 1. What theological argument is the Psalmist making in Psalm 37? How does the Psalmist suggest people should live in relationship to God? Why does the Psalmist believe they should live that way?**
- 2. What images come to mind when you read Psalm 42? How might you visually illustrate this Psalm in a drawing or painting? Why would you use such an illustration?**
- 3. What is the image of God presented in Psalm 46? How is this similar and/or different from the image of God presented in Psalm 36? What does this say to you about the Psalmists' image of God?**
- 4. How might you use Psalm 47 in a worship setting? How might you use it in a non-worship setting? What images come to mind when you read this Psalm? How might you make those images come alive in either a worship or non-worship setting?**
- 5. What charges do Ananias and Tertullus bring against Paul? Why? How does Paul defend himself against these charges?**
- 6. What part of Paul's testimony or defense is most troubling to the Jewish and Roman authorities? Why?**
- 7. How does the Book of Acts end? What happens to Paul? Where does he end up? What is he doing?**
- 8. How does Paul begin his letter to the Romans? According to Paul, what is the problem with humanity? What is the solution to that problem?**
